Annapolis Valley

The Annapolis Valley Site is located throughout the Valley in five communities, with the regional center, Valley Regional Hospital, located in Kentville. Dalhousie University, along with the Department of Health and Wellness, created a proposal for a new residency program to deal with the increase need to produce more family physicians in the province. In the end, the Annapolis Valley Health District Authority was selected as the site for the new program and will be welcoming their first family medicine residents July 2012. Each year, there will be four Canadian medical graduates and one international medical graduate at the Annapolis Valley Site.



By 2013, there will be two residents in the communities of Annapolis Royal, Middleton, Berwick, Kentville/New Minas, and Wolfville. Within every community we have dedicated faculty who are very enthusiastic about the program and are committed to making it a success and one of the best in the province.

UNIQUE FEATURES:

While the Annapolis Valley offers alternative payment plan and fee-for-service family physicians, it also offers one of the first true collaborative practices in Nova Scotia located in Annapolis Royal. Rather than consisting of one physician and one nurse practitioner as seen in other collaborative practices, the Annapolis Royal site boasts six to seven physicians, in addition to a nurse practitioner, an office practice nurse, dietitians, physiotherapists, mental health and social workers; creating a complete team that comes together to manage care.

The Annapolis Valley provides a true rural family medicine experience while at the same time allowing for training in a larger regional center. Residents will be exposed to unique collaborative practices as well as solo practitioners.

CURRICULUM:

The Annapolis Valley site will be one of the first in Canada to utilize the newly approved Triple C curriculum. Approved last year by The College of Family Physicians, this unique curriculum focuses on continuity of care, (rather than quantity of time spent in training); continuity of education/training; and continuity of evaluation, all done predominantly by family doctors. In essence, family doctors will be training the next generation of physicians instead of the traditional specialist block-training of the past. These experiences for the most part will be longitudinal over the two years of residency training in an effort to produce more comprehensive clinical training.

With a focus on the delivery of the new Triple C Curriculum, the curriculum topics will remain the same, however the process in which the residents are trained and evaluated will be modified. We are very excited at the prospect that our residents will receive a truly comprehensive family medicine training in their two years allowing them to provide both acute and chronic care.

For the most part, these experiences will be done in a longitudinal fashion in line with the Triple C curriculum over the two-year training period with a few still being completed in the traditional block format.
